 - 4. Touch

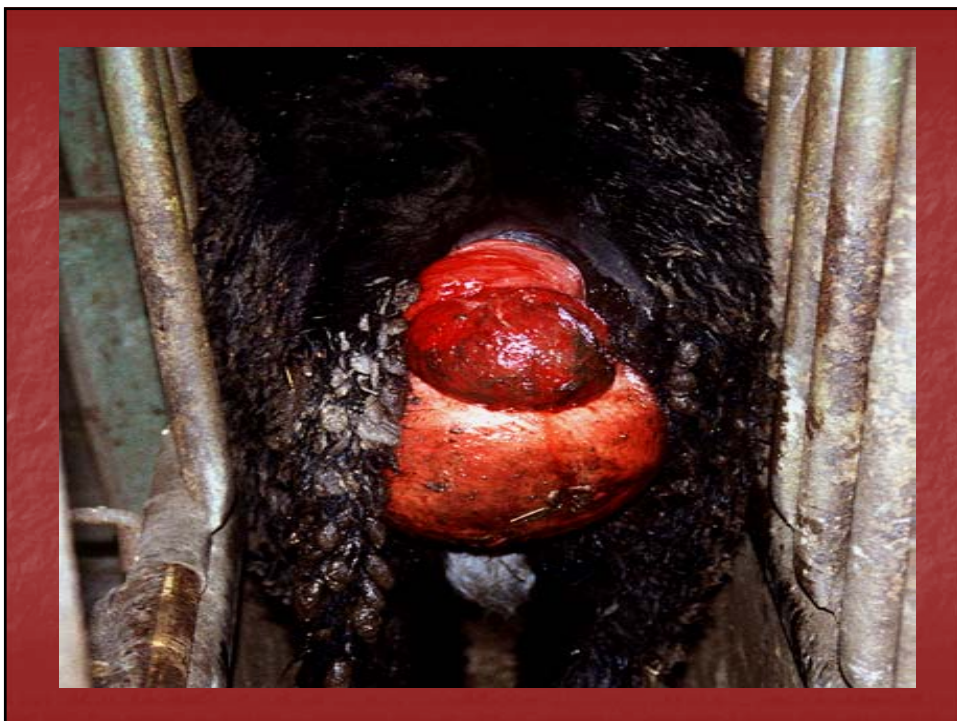
